### ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA No. 1 of 1997

AN ACT tomake provision for the manner in which a referendum shall be held and for other matters incidental thereto and connected therewith.

[ 27th February, 1997 ]

### ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows-

1. This Act may be cited **as the** Referendum Act, 1997.

Short title.

2 For the purposes of determining any question relating to the Constitution of Antigua and Barbuda or **determining** any other question the Rime Minister may consider necessary or desirable, there shall be held **a referendum** in accordance with the provisions of this Act

Holding of a referendum.

3. The question to be **asked** in a referendum held pursuant to section 2, shall be framed in such a manner that a vote is cast for **an** answer which is "YES" or "NO.

Question to be asked in a referendum.

4. (1) The Prime Minister may, sixty days before the date of a **referendum**, by Order, publish the question to be asked in the referendum in the *Gazette*.

Time for publication of question.

(2) The **Order** published pursuant to subsection (1) shall •

No. 1 of 1997.

- (a) appoint the day of the referendum;
- (b) make provision **as** to **the** conduct of the referendum as may appear to the Prime Minister to be **expedient**.

Application of the Representation of the People Act, Cap. 379 5. The **Prime** Mister may, in relation to a referendum, by an **Ordermade by** him, apply any **of the provisions of the Representation** of the People Act or any **regulations** made thereunder, with such modifications or exceptions as he deems necessary or expedient.

# Form of ballot paper to be used.

**6.** The ballot paper to be used in a referendum shall be in the form specified in the Order published by the Prime Minister.

#### Right to vote.

7. Every person who, at the time when a referendum is held would be entitled to vote, in elections of the House, shall be entitled to vote on referendum; and no other person shall be entitled so to vote.

# Conduct of a referendum.

- 8. (1) The polling districts into which constituencies in Antigua and Barbuda have been divided pursuant to section 10 of the Representation of the People Act, Cap 379 shall be the polling districts for a referendum.
- (2) A separate count shall be conducted of the votes cast at a referendum in each of the polling districts referred to in **subsection** (1).

#### Supervisor of Elections to conduct a referendum.

- 9. (1) The Supervisor of Elections shall conduct any referendum held pursuant to section 2.
- (2) The Supervisor of Elections shall for each polling district appoint a Referendum **Officer** and such other officers as he may consider necessary to **assist** the Referendum **Officer**.
- (3) The Referendum Officer and other officers assisting him shall perform such functions as the Supervisor of Elections may direct.
- (4) The functions which in relation to elections conducted under the Representation of the People Act, Cap 379 are conferred on the Supervisor of Elections by section 3 of that Act shall in relation to

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a referendum, be discharged by the Supervisor of Elections.

- (5) The officers referred to in this section include
  - a returning officer; (a)
  - a presiding officer; (b)
  - a referendum clerk; (c)
  - a poll clerk; and (d)
  - an enumerator.
- **10.**(1) Any administrative expenses incurred by the Supervisor of Elections for the purpose of conducting a referendum shall be paid out of Funds provided by Parliament.

Financial

- (2) The Supervisor of Elections, the Referendum Officer and every officer appointed to assist any Referendum Officer shall be paid such remunerations as the Minister of Finance may determine.
- 11. The offences and penalties specified in sections 22 to 28 (both Offences. sections included) of the Representation of the People Act, Cap. 379 shall apply with respect to the conduct of a referendum under this Act.
