## THE STRATEGY FOR THE INQUIRY

These would be held in all 170 Districts in Ghana from April – July 2010.

- 1. The grassroots consultations would be held in collaboration with the National Commission for Civic Education (NCCE), National House of Chiefs and the Metropolitan, Municipal and District Assemblies (MMDAs).
- 2. Vernacular submissions are welcome (translation services can be arranged).
- 3. **Ten** (10) Regional Town Hall Meetings would be convened in town halls in the regions (Northern, Upper East, Upper West, Brong Ahafo, Central, Western, Ashanti, Eastern, Volta and Greater Accra Regions).
- 4. These would be held between August and November 2010.
- 5. Invitations would be opened to all interested stakeholders.
- 6. Groups who want to make submissions should register ahead of time.
- 7. These include Former Heads of State and Government, Parliament, the Judiciary, Political Parties, Media, Living Legends of Constitutional Law and Practice, Traditional Authority, Youth, Civil Society Organizations, Religious leaders, Professional Associations and Bodies, Senior Lawyers, the Ghana Bar Association, Relevant Government Institutions among others.
- 8. These consultations would be held from April 2010 January 2011.
- 9. In collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ghanaians living abroad would be consulted through Ghana's Foreign Missions and Embassies across the world.
- 10. Ghanaians living abroad are also encouraged to make submissions through the website and the Commissions' e-mail address at info@crc.gov.gh.
- 11. The National Conference in January 2011 would Climax all the consultations.
- 12. About 500 Stakeholders from Ghana and abroad with international comparative experience are expected to participate.

A **five-level** consultation strategy will be employed by the Commission in the discharge of its mandate:

- 1. Community and District Level Consultations
- 2. Regional Level Consultations
- 3. Specialized consultations with identifiable groups

- 4. Voices from the Diaspora
- 5. National Constitution Review Conference
