BRIEFING SESSIONS FOR CIVIL SERVANTS

I am directed to provide the following information.

(a) The underlisted officers have been selected to handle portions of the Constitution as stated against their names:-

- (v) Mr. C. Amoako-Edusei - " - Chapters 7,19,20 and 26
- (vi) Mrs. Perpetua N.J. Dontoh- Principal State Attorney- Chapters 6,8,9,12,21
- (vii) Mrs. Comfort Ahwoi - Senior State Attorney - " 22,23,25 and 26
- (viii) Mrs. Ama Gaisie - Senior State Attorney - " "

(b) The rest of the chapters (ie) 1, 2, 4, 13 and the Schedules would be handled by the whole group collectively.


(c) It has been estimated that it would take between 2 to 3 days to go through all the chapters of the Constitution. However, the time element/factor would greatly depend on whether the sessions are organised as lectures or follow a workshop/seminar type of format.

(d) All the resource persons selected above would prefer to participate in these sessions during working hours.

(e) Subject to the availability of adequate accommodation and other facilities there are no objections from the officers to participating in the sessions to be organised in the regions.

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3. I must add that in view of the rather tight time table most of the lawyers encounter at the Law Courts, we should be grateful for adequate notice prior to start of the programme.
