1. National Anthem and Prayer

1. The meeting was called to order by the Chairperson of the National Constitutional Conference (NCC) at 14:30 hours, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and prayer by Bishop Harrison Sakala.

2. Chairperson's Opening Remarks

2. The Chairperson, in his opening remarks, welcomed the members of the Conference to yet another important day when the Conference would begin rewriting the history of Zambia. He stated that the meeting was important in Zambia's long road towards causing itself a good Constitution that would stand the test of time.
3. He informed the Conference that the purpose of the meeting was to adopt the draft rules and regulations that would guide the Conference deliberations in an orderly manner. He stated that the Interim Committee on Rules and Regulations constituted at the last meeting to formulate the afore-mentioned draft rules and regulations had completed its work within the prescribed time-frame.
4. He further welcomed the new members of the Conference and registered the NCC's profound appreciation for their unprecedented step in joining the Conference. He stated that this was evidence that

Zambians were focussed and determined to work out and give themselves a good Constitution.

3. Adoption of Agenda

5. The Agenda of the Meeting was adopted following a proposal by Mr. Alfred Mudenda and seconded by Mr. Mwandila.

4. Announcements by the Secretary

6. The Secretary of the Conference urged the members of the Conference to sign the Attendance Register every day for record keeping purposes.
7. The Secretary also requested members of the Conference, when addressing the Conference, to stand up and state their names for the record of the Conference.
8. He apologised on behalf of Secretariat for the derailment experienced in the payment of allowances. He informed the meeting that Secretariat would improve and perfect the payment system in due course.
9. The Secretary announced that members who were overpaid or underpaid would be dealt with on an individual basis. He stated that Secretariat would write to the affected members and indicate how the individual accounts would be regularised.

5. Consideration and Adoption of the Report of the Interim Committee on Rules and Regulations

10. Following the announcements by the Secretary of Conference, the Chairperson invited Dr. Patrick Matibini, Chairperson of the Interim

Committee on Rules and Regulations to present the report of his Committee. See Annex III for the list of members of the Interim Committee on Rules and Regulations.

11. Dr. Matibini stated that the Committee appointed to develop the regulations, rules of procedure and disciplinary rules for the National Constitutional Conference (NCC) was appointed on 21st December, 2007, pursuant to sub-section (3) of Section 16 of the National Constitutional Conference Act, No.19 of 2007.
12. He stated that the Terms of Reference of the Committee were to lay the ground work for the operations of the NCC. This included the formulation of the rules and regulations that would govern the proceedings of the Conference and establish the NCC Committee system.
13. Dr. Matibini informed the Conference that the Committee held a total number of six meetings during the period from 21st December, 2007 to 5th January, 2008. The Committee, at its first meeting, resolved that the rules establishing the committee system, the rules of procedure for the Conference and its committees and the rules and procedures to govern the maintenance and enforcement of discipline within the NCC and the Secretariat should be reformulated.
14. He stated that in formulating the committee system, the proposals were informed by the content of the Mung'omba Constitution Review Commission Report and the Draft Constitution. To this end, the number and proposed names of the committees were based on both the structure and content of the Report and the Draft Constitution. Therefore, the Terms of Reference of the committees covered each and every article of the Draft Constitution.

15. The Conference was informed that in proposing the procedures to be followed at the committee stage and in the Conference, the Committee recognized the importance of the following matters:
- a) the need to conduct business in an orderly fashion and with dispatch;
 - b) the need to clothe the leadership of the Conference and the committee with sufficient power to manage the business of the Conference and the Committee;
 - c) the need to provide for equal and equitable participation by members both at the Committee stage and in the Conference;
 - d) the need to ensure that the Secretary to the Conference and the Secretariat are given sufficient latitude to manage the affairs of the committees and Conference efficiently and effectively; and
 - e) the need to provide for the participation of the public generally and other persons in particular, whose input may be required at the Committee level in order to ensure that the functions of the Conference are discharged fully.
16. Pursuant to sub-section 2 of section 16 of the National Constitutional Conference Act, No. 19 of 2007 which establishes the Disciplinary Committee, the Committee recognized the need to develop rules governing the maintenance and enforcement of discipline amongst members both at committee level and in the Conference and among the Secretariat staff. The regime of rules and procedures proposed are intended to achieve the following objectives:

- a) To provide for simple, informal and yet just system of governing and enforcing discipline;
 - b) to provide opportunity for members complained against to make adequate written and or oral representations;
 - c) to provide for a speedy resolution of the complaints;
 - d) to provide for a range of options in imposing sanctions against erring members; and
 - e) to provide for an avenue of appeal to the High Court, if need be, to search for legal redress.
17. The Conference heard that the Committee had proposed rules of debate. The proposed rules of debate were intended to give the Chairperson sufficient authority to do the following:
- a) Effectively guide the deliberations;
 - b) ensure orderly debate by members of the Conference; and
 - c) allow for equal and equitable participation of members of the Conference in the deliberations.
18. In conclusion, Dr. Matibini acknowledged the confidence reposed in him and his colleagues on the Committee, with the responsibility of executing and discharging this task of national significance. He also acknowledged the support and commitment that was exhibited throughout the business of the Committee by the members of the Committee and the Chief Parliamentary Counsel and her staff for drafting the instruments in question with proficiency and efficiency.

19. On a personal reflection, Dr. Matibini stated that the opportunity granted to him to lead and serve on the interim Committee to operationalise the NCC gave birth in him of the hope that if all the distinguished delegates pledged and practiced loyalty to the people of Zambia they could together deliver to Zambians what had been yearned for, for a very long time. In order to achieve this feat, he stated that the Conference needed to rise like noble eagles in the Zambian sky, above the diverse sectional interests and unite in flight and diversity. He further stated that Zambia deserved a durable Constitution.

20. Dr. Matibini subsequently submitted to the Conference the following Draft Statutory Instruments for deliberation:

- a) The National Constitutional Conference (Committees) Regulations;
- b) the National Constitutional Conference (Procedure) Rules; and
- c) the National Constitutional Conference (Disciplinary Committee Proceedings) Rules.

6. Consideration and Adoption of the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Committees) Rules, 2008

21. By way of introduction of the above-mentioned Draft Rules, Dr. Matibini informed the Conference that this Statutory Instrument was intended to establish the NCC committee system. He stated that the detailed discussion of both the Report and the Draft Constitution would be conducted in the committees and subsequently all

committees would be required to submit their reports to the Conference.

22. He stated that Rule 3 set out the proposed Committees. The proposed committees are actually based on the content of both the Draft Constitution and the Mung'omba Report. For instance, the Executive Committee was committed to the discussion of the Executive branch of Government and similarly, the Judicial Committee referred to the part dealing with the Judiciary. Further, he stated that the Draft rules had captured the two (2) statutory committees, namely, the Disciplinary Committee and the Drafting Committee. The rules also established the General Purposes Committee meant to deal with general matters. This Committee would consist of all the Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons of the Committees.

23. The Conference noted the following:

- a. That the draft Statutory Instrument did not stipulate the frequency of the sittings of the committees. This would be an administrative matter, to be determined by the Secretariat;
- b. That the Minister of Justice would comply with the provisions of the NCC Act when appointing members of the Drafting Committee;
- c. That the Committees were allowed by the NCC Act to deal with issues not addressed in the draft Constitution; and
- d. That members of the Conference were allowed to make written submissions to committees to which they did not belong.

24. After a lengthy debate on the matter, the Conference agreed, in relation to Rule 4 (1), that the Conference, as opposed to the Secretary of the Conference, should determine the number of members that each committee would have. This was done in line with subsection 3 of section 16 of the NCC Act which empowers the Conference to constitute committees for the purposes of performing its functions. Subsection 3 of section 16 states that:

“(3) The Conference may, for the purpose of performing its functions under this Act, constitute any committee and delegate to any such committee such of its functions as it thinks fit.”

25. Therefore, the phrase *“A committee shall comprise such number of members as the Secretary to the Conference may determine”* was replaced by the phrase *“A committee shall comprise such number of members as the Conference may determine”*.

26. Sub-rule (4) of Rule 5, which stated that *“A committee may authorize the publication of any information given before it and any document presented to it.”*, was deleted. The Conference was of the view that the said provision contradicted section 20 of the NCC Act which allowed members of the press to be present in the deliberations of the Conference or its committees.

27. Sub-rule 1 of Rule 7 reading *“A committee shall, at its first sitting elect a chairperson, vice chairperson and secretary of the committee from amongst the members of the committee”* was amended to read as follows: *“A committee shall, at its first sitting elect a chairperson and vice chairperson of the committee from amongst the members of the committee”*.

28. This amendment followed a discussion by the Conference as to whether there was a need to elect secretaries from amongst the

members of the committee to perform a liaison role between the respective committees and the Secretariat. The Conference was of the view that this was not necessary as there would be no reporting channels to the other secretaries. Further, the Conference noted that the job of a secretary was technical and administrative.

29. The Conference agreed that meetings of the Conference should be convened by the Secretary at the direction of the Chairperson of the Conference. In this regard, sub-rule 1 of Rule 8 was amended to reflect this.
30. The word "*Conference*" appearing in paragraphs (a) and (b) of Rule 9 was replaced by the word "*Committee*", respectively.
31. Rule 12 was amended in order to grant immunity to persons who give evidence before a committee.
32. Rule 14 was amended by replacing the word "*return*" with the word "*reject*".
33. The Conference requested that all the terms of reference of the committees be amended to allow them to discuss related matters.

7. Adjournment

34. The meeting adjourned at 19:52 hours to the following day at 14:00 hours, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and prayer by Pastor Godfridah Sumaili.

WEDNESDAY, 9TH JANUARY, 2008

1. National Anthem and Prayer

1. The meeting was called to order by the Chairperson of the National Constitutional Conference (NCC) at 14:30 hours, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and prayer by Reverend David Musonda Masupa.

2. Chairperson's Opening Remarks

2. The Chairperson informed the Conference that it would continue considering the Report of the Interim Committee on Rules and Regulations. He stated that in order to maximise participation of members of the Conference, he requested members to ensure that they caught the attention of the Chairperson so that they are given an opportunity to speak.

3. Announcements by the Secretary

3. The Secretary informed the Conference that Tea would be served at 16:00 hours and 18:00 hours. The Tea Breaks would last 20 minutes each.
4. The Secretary informed the members that the eastern gate of the Mulungushi International Conference Centre would be open for those who wished to use it.

5. He apologised for the Secretariat not having distributed the Agenda for the day. This was due to the fact that the photocopier had stopped working. He informed the meeting that the Secretariat was doing everything possible to ensure that fresh copies of the Agenda were distributed.
4. **Continuation of the Consideration and Adoption of the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Committees) Rules, 2008**
6. After consideration and adoption of the Terms of Reference of the various committees, the Conference adopted the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Committees) Rules, 2008 as amended, with Hon. Malwa proposing and Mrs. Betty Ilunga seconding the motion for adoption.
5. **Consideration and Adoption of the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Disciplinary Committee Proceedings) Rules, 2008**
7. Following the adoption of the draft National Constitutional Conference (Committees) Rules, 2008, the Chairperson invited Dr. Matibini to give an executive summary of the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Disciplinary Committee Proceedings) Rules, 2008.
8. In his summary, Dr. Matibini stated that the above-mentioned draft Statutory Instrument was intended to provide the procedure that would govern the Disciplinary Committee established by the NCC Act. He stated that the rules were meant for the maintenance and enforcement of the discipline in the Conference.

9. Dr. Matibini stated that the basis upon which discipline would be maintained was a complaint, which would emanate from different sources including the Conference and from the Committee stage. He stated that once a complaint was initiated and lodged with the Disciplinary Committee, the above-mentioned Rules would govern the proceedings or the procedure in which these complaints would be treated.
10. Dr. Matibini stated that the Interim Committee had also provided for a number of ancillary issues, including issues of interim measures, provision for legal representation for those who feel it is necessary to instruct lawyers to assist them respond to allegations or complaints. He further stated that provision had been made for the compilation of dossiers or evidence in support of or in resistance to complaints, issues of service of documents and amendments of the proceedings. He informed the Conference that, in a nutshell, the approach was very technical but every effort was made to make the procedure as simple and as cost effective as possible.
11. In the discussion of the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Disciplinary Committee Proceedings) Rules, 2008 the Conference agreed that the term "*Chairperson*" should be defined.
12. Paragraph (c) of Rule 4 reading "*This Committee shall consider any other matter referred to it by the Conference*" was amended with the addition of the word "*disciplinary*" between the words "*other*" and "*matter*". The amendment was effected to ensure that the other matters to be referred to the Disciplinary Committee should have relevance to its work and as such should be related to matters of discipline.
13. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 5 which allowed a person lodging a complaint before the Disciplinary Committee to recommend the course

of action to be taken against the person complained against was amended. This amendment was effected in order to allow any person to lodge a complaint before the Disciplinary Committee under certain circumstances. However, the course of action to be taken against an erring member or member of staff was to be determined by the Disciplinary Committee.

14. After a lengthy debate on the matter Sub-rule 1 of Rule 5 which stated *“A person may complain to the Committee that disciplinary action be taken against a member or member of staff...”* was redrafted to read *“A complaint may be lodged with the Disciplinary Committee against a member or member of staff where it is alleged that the member or member of staff has...”*. This text was a compromise which was in line with subsection 2 of section 16 of the Act and would allow complaints under that Act to be filed before the Committee. This text would allow the Committee to interpret whether any person, whether from within or outside the Conference, could file a complaint.
15. Two conflicting views on this matter dominated the discussion: Some members were of the view that members of the public should not be allowed to make complaints against members of the Conference and staff of Secretariat as this would be subject to abuse from those who oppose the work of the Conference. However, some members were of the view that members of the public should be allowed to lodge complaints before the Disciplinary Committee against members of the Conference and staff of Secretariat to avoid suspicion. It was stated that it was, however, necessary for the Disciplinary Committee to discern a frivolous complaint from one which was serious.
16. Rule 12 which read *“The Committee may, where any party fails to appear at the hearing, upon proof of service on such party of the notice of hearing, proceed to hear and determine the complaint in that party’s absence”* was

amended by adding the word “twice” between the words “ hearing” and “upon”. This amendment was effected to allow a member who had not appeared before the Disciplinary Committee twice for genuine reasons to be given another opportunity to do so.

17. Rule 15 was amended in order to allow the Secretary to the Cabinet to appoint another person to replace a member who is removed from office on the recommendation of the Disciplinary Committee. This amendment was effected with the addition of the following sub-rule:

(3) “The Secretary to the Cabinet shall, where a member is removed on the recommendation of the Disciplinary Committee under these Rules, appoint another member to replace the member who is removed in accordance with section four of the Act.”

18. The Conference agreed to amend sub-rule (1) of Rule 18 in order to allow an individual to withdraw a complaint without the intervention of the Committee if he or she so decided.
19. The Conference agreed to delete the provision allowing the Disciplinary Committee to order any party to pay the costs of the proceedings if misconduct is not proved against any member or member of staff.
20. The word “complaint” in Rule 19 was replaced by the word “application”.
21. The Conference discussed at length Rule 11, which allowed any party to the disciplinary proceedings to be represented by a legal practitioner. Rule 11 stated:

“Any party to the proceedings under these rules may be represented by a legal practitioner of that party’s choice.”

22. There were two schools of thought on this matter: On the one hand, some members stated that parties appearing before the Disciplinary Committee should not be represented by a legal practitioner because this requirement may disadvantage the other parties who may not be able to afford the services of lawyers and that the practice in many organisations did not make legal representation a requirement.
23. On the other hand, some members of the Conference were of the view that the clause in question should be retained because legal representation in courts or tribunals was a Constitutional right.
24. A decision on this question was deferred to the next day at 14:00 hours due to the lateness of the hour.

6. Adjournment

25. The meeting adjourned at 20:05 hours to the following day at 14:00 hours, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and prayer by Bishop Banda.

THURSDAY, 10TH JANUARY, 2008

1. National Anthem and Prayer

1. The meeting was called to order by the Chairperson of the National Constitutional Conference (NCC) at 14:30 hours, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and prayer by Reverend Mary Zulu Mwiche.

2. Chairperson's Opening Remarks

2. The Chairperson welcomed all the members present.

3. Announcements by the Secretary

3. The Secretary of the Conference reported, in respect of the Conference bags requested by members of the Conference, that the Cabinet Office had advised that the procurement of the Conference bags was still in process.
4. The Secretary requested members of the Conference to inform the Secretariat of any corrections to be made to the Record of the First Meeting of the Conference, which was circulated the previous day.
5. Lastly, the Secretary announced that the payment of the applicable allowances would be made on Friday, 11th January 2008 at the Mulungushi International Conference Centre (MICC) from 09:30 hours to late afternoon.

4. Brief by the Electoral Commission of Zambia (ECZ) on the Elections for the Positions of Members of the Disciplinary Committee

6. Following the announcements by the Secretary of the Conference, officials from the Electoral Commission of Zambia (ECZ) were requested by the Chairperson to brief members of the Conference on the guidelines to be followed in the election of members of the Disciplinary Committee.

5. **Continuation of Consideration and Adoption of the Draft National Constitutional Conference (Disciplinary Committee Proceedings) Rules, 2008**

7. The Chairperson informed the Conference that the Secretariat requested the Attorney-General to provide his legal opinion on the question of legal representation before the Disciplinary Committee which was considered by the Conference the previous day but not concluded.

8. The Chairperson informed the Conference that the Attorney-General had responded to the above-mentioned request and stated that the right to legal representation was founded in the Common Law upon which the justice system of Zambia was founded. He stated that the Supreme Court had continually upheld that a person had the option to retain Counsel of his or her choice. He stated that whilst the Constitution of Zambia specifically recognised the right to representation in criminal cases, that right was extended to civil proceedings by virtue of the Common Law. He stated that it was important to note that the Disciplinary Committee would sit as a Quasi-Judicial Body and as such any party appearing before such a

body had a right to a fair trial or hearing. He stated that the tenets of a fair trial or hearing demanded that one has the right to be represented by a person of his choice. In that regard, the Attorney-General was of the considered view that Rule 11 be retained in its current form.

9. Following the above advice from the Attorney-General the Conference agreed to retain draft Rule 11 in its current form.

10. The Conference thereafter adopted the draft Rules.

6. Consideration and Adoption of the Report on the National Constitutional Conference (Procedure) Rules, 2008

11. Dr. Matibini, at the request of the Chairperson proceeded to give a brief overview of the National Constitutional Conference (Procedure) Rules, 2008.

12. He stated that these Rules were intended to govern the business of the Conference. The first part of the Rules referred to the title, application as well as interpretation. The second part referred to issues of sittings of the Conference and the more crucial parts of the Draft Statutory Instrument referred to the procedure and the rules of debate.

13. He stated that most of the Rules under Conference Procedures were meant to facilitate the orderly business of the Conference and in formulating these Rules, the Interim Committee was alive to the fact that there was need to clothe the Chairperson with sufficient power and authority to maintain order in the conduct of the debate and to ensure that the Chairperson had sufficient power to direct the proceedings.

14. He stated that Part IV of the draft Rules contained the Rules of Debate and Part V affected the Secretary and the Secretariat and placed a specific obligation on the Secretariat to ensure that the proceedings of the Conference were maintained.
15. Following the presentation by Dr. Matibini, the Conference agreed to include in the draft Rules the definitions of the terms "*Vice-Chairpersons*", "*Spokesperson*" and "*General Purposes Committee*". The Conference also agreed to elaborate the functions of the Spokesperson in the body of the draft Rules.
16. The Conference agreed to amend Rule 4 in order to allow the Conference to adjourn its proceedings early if it concluded its business before the scheduled time.
17. The Conference were of the view that Sub-rule 1 of Rule 4 should be amended to reflect that the Conference would not meet on public holidays.
18. The marginal note in Rule 6 was amended to read "*Sitting dates*" to reflect the contents of Rule 6 as opposed to the use of the words "*Sitting Programme*" originally used. Further, Rule 6 was reformulated to provide at least 14 days notice to ensure that all members, especially those living in far flung areas, get adequate notice of meetings of the Conference.
19. Rules 8 and 9 were swapped to ensure that the provisions followed a logical sequence.
20. Rule 12 was amended by deleting the words "and the galleries" because the definition of the word "chamber" included the galleries.

21. The word "House" appearing in Rule 11 (a) was replaced by the word "Chamber".
22. The Conference agreed to recast sub-Rule (1) of Rule 14 in order to outline the circumstances under which the Secretary may order a person to leave the Chamber as a result of interruption of the proceedings of the Conference.
23. Sub-rule (2) of Rule 14 was recast to empower the Chairperson to order or cause the removal of a person who is not a member by any Police Officer.
24. Sub-rule (3) of Rule 16 reading "*Where the Chairperson adjourns the sitting, it stands adjourned until its next sitting day.*" was amended to read "*Where the Chairperson adjourns a sitting, it shall stand adjourned until the next sitting day.*"
25. The Conference agreed to elaborate Rule 15 in order to outline the circumstances under which a member may move a motion, without notice, that members of the public be ordered to leave the Chamber.
26. Rule 20 was deleted as its contents were already covered by Rule 48 of the draft Regulations.
27. The word "and" after Rule 26 (1) (a) was replaced by the word "or".
28. The Conference agreed that a new paragraph in Rule 29 be introduced in order to allow members to be referred to by their names and the name of the organisation they belong to.
29. The Conference further agreed that the term "Points of Order" be defined in the draft Rules.

30. Rule 31 was deleted.
31. It was agreed that sub-rule 2 of Rule 32 reading "*The Chairperson shall authorise the use of any other language in the proceedings of the Conference if adequate provision has been made for the translation thereof into English.*" be deleted because it was felt that all the members could speak English.
32. It was agreed that Rule 44 should be deleted as its contents were already covered by Rule 11.
33. The words "Rule 41" were replaced by the words "Rule 40".
34. There was an extensive debate on sub-rule (2) of Rule 48 of the draft Rules which stated as follows:
- "(2) All questions before the Conference shall be determined by consensus, but in the absence of consensus, the decisions of the Conference shall be determined by a two-thirds majority vote of the members."*
35. Some members were of the view that this provision meant that in the absence of consensus on a question before the Conference, the decisions of the Conference would be determined by a two-thirds majority vote of **all the members of the Conference**.
36. While others felt that the above-mentioned sub-rule meant that the decisions of the Conference would be determined by a two-thirds majority vote of the **members present in the meeting**, if there was no consensus on a question before the Conference.
37. In order to make progress on the matter, the Conference agreed that since this provision was a reproduction of sub-section (7) of section 17 of the Act, then the contents of sub-rule (2) of Rule 48 would have to be

maintained. However, the Conference agreed that a legal opinion should be sought from the Attorney-General or the courts as to its meaning. It was agreed that this legal opinion be availed to the Conference at its next session.

38. The Conference agreed to provide a procedure that should be followed in the event that the Conference failed to garner consensus. It was agreed that members of the Conference should be allowed to demand a division if consensus on a matter is not garnered. In this regard, it was agreed that not less than one hundred members could demand for a division. This provision would be extended to the committees established by the Conference on a proportional basis.

39. Following the discussion on issues in paragraph 38 above, the Draft Rules were adopted with Hon. Ronnie Shikapwasha, MP proposing and Engineer Monica Milupi seconding the motion for adoption.

7. Nominations for the Positions of Members of the Disciplinary Committee of the National Constitutional Conference

40. Nominations for the positions of members of the Disciplinary Committee of the Conference were conducted.

41. At the end of the nominations, Hon. Mutale Nalumango, MP, Ms. Grace Lombe Chitambala, Ms. Charity Mpande and Hon. Grace Njapau, MP, emerged unopposed as members of the Disciplinary Committee. Mr Bwalya Chiti also emerged unopposed as the member of the Disciplinary Committee, who was a legal practitioner as required by subsection (2) of section 16 of the Act. Nine (9) other members, namely: Hon. Robbie Chizyuka, MP, Hon. Sakwiba Sikota, MP, Mr. Lazarus Chota, Senior Chief Imwiko, Rev. David Masupa, Dr. Cornelius Matandiko, Col. Joseph Miti, Mr. Edwin Sakala and Mr. Sage

Samuwika successfully filed in their nominations for the positions of members of the Conference.

8. Elections of Disciplinary Committee Members

42. Elections for the positions of members of the Disciplinary Committee were conducted. Dr. Cornelius Matandiko, Senior Chief Imwiko and Hon. Sakwiba Sikota, MP, were elected with 332, 276 and 270 votes respectively. Colonel Joseph Miti received 17 votes, Mr. Edwin Sakala, 21 votes, Rev. David Masupa, 36 votes, Mr. Sage Samuwika, 53 votes, Lazarus Chota, 95 votes and Hon. Robbie Chizyuka, MP, 172 votes.

9. Composition of Committees

43. The Secretariat requested members of the Conference to indicate the committees which they preferred to participate in, highlighting their first, second and third preferences. Members were requested to indicate the above-mentioned preferences in booklets which were circulated by the Secretariat.
44. Members were then informed that the Secretariat would place members into the various committees taking into consideration their respective preferences and areas of expertise. The members were further informed that the membership of the various committees would be presented to the Conference at its next session for approval.
45. The members were also informed that the Conference, at its next sitting, would break into committees in order to facilitate the election of Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons of those committees. Once that exercise had been undertaken, the Chairperson would proceed to

announce the members of the General Purposes Committee, who will comprise the Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons of the various committees.

10. Date of Next Meeting

46. Members of the Conference were informed that the date of the next meeting would be communicated at a later date.

11. Closing

47. In closing, the Chairperson thanked the members of the Conference for their commitment to the exercise, which was exhibited by the almost one hundred per cent (100%) attendance. He urged the members to continue with this spirit.

48. There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 23:15 hours. This was followed by a prayer by Rev. Mbewe and the singing of the National Anthem.
